Household Batteries

In February 2006, the State of California banned the disposal of household batteries in your trash. These must be treated as hazardous waste. Most household type batteries include rechargeable nickel-cadmium batteries, silver button batteries, mercury batteries, alkaline batteries, and other batteries that exhibit the characteristics of a hazardous waste.

Household batteries, including car and truck batteries, may be dropped off for free at these County of Sacramento facilities:
