C. Definitions. Read and understand these terms. Call County staff at (916) 875-4049 if the meaning of these terms is not clear to you.

1. Self-haul or self-hauling: This is when the builder or subcontractor who is doing work on the project hauls their own waste materials for recycling or disposal. Note that a jobsite cleanup company is not doing other work on the project and is not self-hauling. Jobsite cleanup companies **must** be Franchised.

2. Franchised hauler: See list provided at www.wmr.saccounty.net/Pages/Construction-Demolition.aspx. These are the only companies in Sacramento County who can legally collect and haul mixed construction and demolition debris.

3. Source separation: This is achieving compliance with the recycling requirement by keeping recyclables from being mixed with trash / un-recyclable material. If you have space to accommodate source separation, it's a good way to save money.

4. Mixed Waste Recovery: This is achieving compliance with the recycling requirement by putting all debris into one container or truck / trailer and sending it to a certified C&D sorting facility to have the recyclable material extracted and recycled. If your jobsite is crowded, mixed recovery is a simple way to achieve compliance.

5. Certified C&D Sorting Facility: See list provided at www.wmr.saccounty.net/Pages/Construction-Demolition.aspx. These are the only facilities that can provide recycling credit for loads of C&D that have mixed types of materials in them ("Mixed C&D"). They sort the recyclable material out of the load.

F. Terms and Conditions

- County staff may enter the jobsite to inspect construction and demolition debris (“C&D”) waste collection areas.
- Per the requirements of CALGreen, the California Green Building Code, 65% of all C&D debris generated must be recycled.
- Only SWA-Certified C&D Sorting Facilities may be used to sort recyclable material if debris is mixed.
- Only SWA-Franchised Haulers may be hired to collect and transport trash or mixed C&D material off the jobsite.
- Construction and Demolition Debris may not be burned or dumped illegally.
- A completed *Waste Log* must be submitted prior to your final inspection. All waste hauling and disposal or recycling activity must be entered on the *Waste Log*, including information from any subcontractors who self-hauled their own debris off-site.
- You must keep all receipts or weight-tickets from your project for a period of one year from the submittal of your *Waste Log* weight tickets must be provided upon request.
- Failure to comply with these terms and conditions may result in “Corrections Needed” Notices and the requirement for additional recycling of any shortfall amounts. Non-compliance may also result in Civil Penalties up to \$1000.
- Repeated non-compliance may result in Recycling Performance Deposits being required before the issuance of your next building permit.

I have read, understand, and take responsibility for this project's compliance with CALGreen, Chapter 6.20 of County Code and the Terms and Conditions of this Waste Management Plan.
