

STEPS TO HOSTING A CLEAN-UP

### Planning

First, decide if the clean-up will be virtual or socially-distanced. We ask that all organizers maintain **current COVID-19 gathering guidelines. Refer to this website**.

### VIRTUAL CLEAN-UP

As a business owner, you can have a large impact in the neighborhood of your business's location. Using the resources available to you, you can promote a virtual clean-up to your social media followers. Even virtually, you can build your community's commitment to cleaner streets. You can encourage your followers to organize a group of people to go out near their homes and clean-up their streets! After your clean up is over, let each other know how many bags each individual group collected. Report your total on our website. **BeRiverFriendly.net** 

### SOCIALLY DISTANCED

Pick your favorite social media app, and create a post letting people know that you are hosting a virtual cleanup! Choose a date(s), announce a goal, create your own hashtag and encourage people to get involved!





### **Choose A Location**

When looking for a location, make sure you choose a high-trash area. Parking lots, sidewalks, and parks are a great place to start. The goal of your clean-up is to stop trash from going into the storm drains, so do your best to pick a place that likely gathers a lot of trash.

### SUGGESTED SUPPLIES

- + Personal Protective Equipment (such as masks or face shields)
- + Trash bags
- + Bucket
- + Trash grabber
- + Gloves
- + Close-toed shoes
- + Water
- + Sunscreen
- + Hand sanitizer





### Last Minute Tips

- + If you encounter sharp objects (like needles) do NOT pick them up, report them by calling 3-1-1.
- + If you head into nature, look out for poison oak.
- + Dispose of trash in a public garbage can or your home garbage/recycle bin.
- Share your clean up on social media! Use the hashtag
  #TrashYourTrash and encourage others to get involved.
- + Avoid homeless camps.
- + Be aware of traffic and do not attempt to pick up litter in roadways.
- + In parks, creeks/natural areas, follow all posted signage and limit activities to areas open to the public.
- + If you clean up a local waterway, be mindful of the conditions and be careful near the water's edge.
- + Keep a safe distance from all wildlife!
- + Leave nature as-is! Do not pick up or disturb natural objects, such as leaves or branches.





### **Promote Your Clean-Up**

To promote your clean-up on social media, we recommend you create a Facebook event.

To create an event on Facebook, simply go to your:

- + "Newsfeed" and click Events
- + Click "Create New Event"
- + Follow the steps as it guides you

### SIMPLE ACTIONS to keep your business litter-free!

Did you know that your business's actions can impact water quality? Rain, irrigation water, or wind can carry trash and other pollutants into a storm drain, which flows untreated to a creek or river.

Your business's litter prevention actions are important for keeping Sacramento's streets and waterways clean. Follow these simple steps to prevent pollution:

- Make proper disposal convenient and accessible by providing enough trash, cigarette butts, and recycling receptacles inside and outside your establishment.
- Keep outdoor trash cans covered and empty them on a regular basis to prevent overflow.
- Do not hose down trash or debris into storm drains. Sweep up trash and discard in a garbage or dumpster.
- Post signs at trash bins to remind employees to keep lids closed and help prevent overflowing trash cans.
- Post signs to encourage customers to properly trash their trash or recycle waste.

- Replace leaking dumpsters.
- Consider switching to environmentallyfriendly products for food take-out or delivery services when possible.
- Regularly clean litter, including cigarette butts, from areas surrounding the facility and dispose of them in a trash bin.
- Post signs to encourage customers to properly trash their trash or recycle waste.
- Host a community clean up around surrounding neighborhoods! This is a great way to show your community that you care about the environment. Go to beriverfriendly.net to get started!
