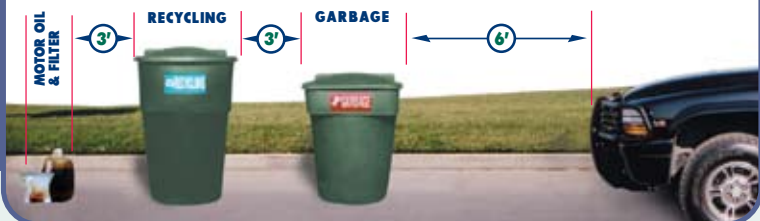

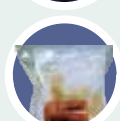
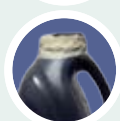
# Curbside Used Motor Oil and Oil Filter Recycling

## Recycling & Garbage Set-Out



To provide better customer service, the County of Sacramento has made the following changes in the way you recycle used motor oil and filters at the curb:

1. Place your used motor oil in any rigid or semi-rigid plastic container no larger than five (5) quarts, such as milk/juice/water jugs and detergent or motor oil bottles.
2. The container top must be securely closed to prevent spillage. A screw top is best.
3. All snap top lids must be taped shut.
4. Used oil filters must be drained of oil and sealed in a zip-lock type plastic bag.



Remember, please:

- Do not contaminate used motor oil by mixing with other automotive fluids;
- Recycle used motor oil and oil filters only... NO ANTIFREEZE;
- Used motor oil and filters will be collected on the same day as your mixed recycling container;
- Do not place used motor oil or filters in the mixed recycling container; place oil and filters on the ground at least three (3) feet away from your mixed recycling container; and
- Do not set out more than three (3) gallons of used motor oil per recycling collection day.

# Curbside Used Motor Oil and Oil Filter Recycling

## FOLLOW THESE EASY GUIDELINES

### YES:



Place used oil in rigid or semi-rigid plastic container no larger than five (5) quarts.



Securely close container; screw top is best.



Snap top lids must be taped shut.



Drain used oil filter and place in sealed zip-lock type plastic bag.

### NO:



No glass or other non-plastic containers.



No loose snap top lids.



No loose snap top lids.



No loose oil filters.
